



**Turnstile**  
**12" block**  
**4 Fabrics**

**Cutting:**

**Blue:**

4 rectangles @ 6 1/2" x 2 1/2"  
4 rectangles @ 4 1/2" x 2 1/2"

**Cream:**

4 squares @ 2 7/8" cut once on the diagonal

**Red and Yellow—cut same amount for both colors**

6 squares @ 2 1/2"

1 Square @ 5 1/4" cut twice on the diagonal—you will have 2 quarter square triangles left over (Option 2—Use a quarter square ruler. Cut a strip of each color 2 5/8" by about 8 1/4". Then cut the 2 triangles needed for each color) No wasted triangles.

**Piecing:**

**Two-Patch Units:**

Sew 1 Red and 1 Yellow 2 1/2" squares together. Make 4.



**Flying Geese Units:**

Sew Cream 2 7/8" triangles to the short sides of the Red quarter-square triangles. Make 2.



Sew Cream 2 7/8" triangles to the short sides of the Yellow quarter-square triangles. Make 2.



**Rectangle Units:**

Draw a diagonal line on the back of the remaining 2 Yellow and 2 Red 2 1/2" squares.

Place a Yellow square on top and at one end of a Blue 4 1/2" x 2 1/2" rectangle.

Sew on the drawn line Make 2.



Repeat with the Red Square and a Blue rectangle. Make 2.



**Quarter Block:**

Sew the units just made into quarter blocks following the layouts below:

Make two of each colorway.



Following the block layout sew these into 2 rows. Sew the rows together to complete the block. I made mine from a fat-quarter mystery pack of batiks.
